To ensure the orderly conduct and efficiency of the meeting, public comments shall be limited to three (3) minutes maximum per person; however, the Mayor may authorize the extension of the aforesaid time frame, and any extension shall apply to other individuals speaking on the same subject.

No clapping, applauding, heckling, verbal outburst in support of, or in opposition to a speaker or his/her remarks shall be permitted. Should a member of the audience become unruly, or behave in any manner that disrupts the orderly and efficient conduct of the meeting, the Mayor is given the right and the authority to require such person to leave the Council Chambers.

As a courtesy to others, all electronic devices must be set to silent mode to avoid disruption of the proceedings.






It's about removing barriers, equal access for everyone...and it's the law



# ADA Title III Website Accessibility Lawsuits in Federal Court (2017-2018)




Top 10 States for ADA Title III Website Accessibility

New York and Florida.





4% of lawsuits came from other states such as Texas, Massachusetts, California, Georgia and Pennsylvania

OCR -> Text Recognition + Manually Labeling Images, Signatures, Artwork...





- The DOJ is considering proposing WCAG 2.0 Level AA as the accessibility standard for websites and web content.
- The DOJ noted that WCAG 2.0 has become the internationally recognized benchmark for web accessibility (the Revised 508 Standards are based on WCAG 2.0)
- A final rule specifying technical standards under the ADA has not been adopted yet. Until the DOJ adopts specific technical requirements for web accessibility in a final rule, there is flexibility in determining how to make websites compliant with ADA











## TOML Website – Desktop Vs. Mobile

■ Website Access: 350k (last 3 years):








## Desktop Vs. Mobile Worldwide Web Access Share 2010-2018

## **Key Outcomes**



50% installed websites' ADA auditing tools

66% sending docs to 3<sup>rd</sup> party remediation services

83% contracted 3<sup>rd</sup> party website designers/developers

100% still defining the process of complex remediation



Steps Taken by Other Municipalities to Conform with ADA



## **Steps & Options**

- 1 > In-house and/or 3<sup>rd</sup> Party (per priority/request)
  - > Replace non-compliance docs



- 2 > Redesign & deploy new site
  - > Overlay a JAVA script (mask)

- > Auditing content tool
- **3** ➤ Auditing website tool
  - > Create accessible Docs Get-Go

## Data Analysis



Simple docs: 4,000 PDF files (equiv. to 600,000 pages)

Complex docs: 200 PDF files (equiv. to 20,000 pages)

No more than 3 years of data is been accessed or downloaded

Cost to Remediate all Content via 3rd Party: \$8M to \$10M

#### Recommendation:

Remove Content 4 years old or more

**Remediate** Last 3 years

**Develop New Website** 

Acquire Remediation Tools

Train Personnel


### **Estimated Investment:**

Item	One-Time Cost	Recurrent Cost
Basic Docs (1 FTE + Temp/Help)	\$45,000	\$30,000
Complex Docs (3 <sup>rd</sup> Party)	\$60,000	\$20,000
New Website	\$70,000	\$15,000
Remediation Tools	\$10,000	\$10,000
Training	\$5,000	\$1,000
GRANT TOTAL	\$190,000	\$76,000
