To the Town Council,

We were excited to start off 2024 by presenting to the town residents & area leaders, our Special Needs Safety Program workshop that was held on January 25<sup>th</sup> at the Town Hall. We had one of our best attendance records yet. Thank you to Deputy Attorney Lorenzo Cobiella, Town Officer Robin Amador, Councilwoman Marilyn Ruano and Councilman Josh Dieguez who all participated in the forum. It gave us a chance to really showcase the program and how it can help keep families in the Town of Miami Lakes safe, and better connect our residents with the Miami Dade Police Department.

We are looking forward to numerous new and ongoing programs getting kicked off for the year, including our upcoming DOJO Program that will offer non-contact training at the Miami Lakes Youth Center, with an Open House set for Monday February 26<sup>th</sup> at 4:30PM and classes start on March 11th (Every Monday) at 4:30PM for a period of 10 weeks.

In addition to that, our events are ramping up with the Valentine's Day Painting with a Twist program, which this year we've rented out the whole facility to be able to open it to our younger and older adults with special needs, as well as members of the general public in an effort to be more inclusive. We have space for a total of 50 participants.

We also anticipate getting started with other programs you approved in our previous presentation back in November, including a sensory friendly movie during summer break, participation in various existing holiday events across the town (4<sup>th</sup> of July, etc) as well as the return of our annual program of spectrum dance classes hosted by Arts for Autism. These are in the works and are being pushed into subcommittees as we speak.

Finally, we were able to accept the previous Mayor's Gala funds into our budget, which our board elected to send \$5,000 to community awareness, \$10,000 into community programs, \$10,000 into social and recreational, \$5,000 into training and \$2,302.60 into grants and aids, which equals the total amount donated from the Gala of \$32,302.60.

This year's Mayor's Gala date is set for September 28<sup>th</sup>, 6:30 to 11PM and we aiming at working with the Graham Companies in an effort to bring the Gala to the Miami Lakes Hotel.

There's a lot to be done so be looking for SNAB to be out and about all year.
