Subject: Proposed adoption of the State Legislative Priorities for FY2025

Date: October 7th, 2024

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Town Council authorize the Town Manager to amend, finalize, and pursue the FY2025 State Legislative Priorities, and if funded, to authorize the Town Manager to accept grant funds, execute the grant agreements, take all necessary steps to implement the terms and conditions of the agreements, approved legislative priorities.

Background:

On September 3rd, 2024, the Miami Lakes 2025 Legislative Priorities Strategy Sunshine Meeting was held at Town Hall to discuss the Staff legislative recommendations for pursuit.

The following are the suggested FY2025 legislative priorities for pursuit, in order of priority, and set forth in the amended Exhibit "A":

Stormwater/Water Infrastructure Projects:

- 1) NW 79th Ave Drainage Improvements \$1,915,000
- 2) Sevilla Estates Phase II Drainage Improvement- \$2,570,000
- 3) Big Cypress Drive Drainage Improvement \$1,002,500

Infrastructure/Transportation/Roadway Projects:

- 1) Miami Lakes NW 154th Street to NW 77th Court Turn Lane Extension Transportation Improvements Project \$630,000
- Miami Lakes NW 155th Street Parking and Turn Lane Transportation Improvements Project-\$615,000
- 3) Miami Lakes Drive Milling, Resurfacing, and ADA Safety Improvements Phase 1 Project-\$3,000,000
- 4) Miami Lakes Pedestrian Safety and Signalization Improvements Project-\$450,000

 - d. Urging the State Marshal to provide support and resources to aid the Town's efforts at seeking reforms to State rock mine blasting legislation (R24-2010).

The Town Manager will communicate the amended and approved list of FY2025 State Legislative Priorities to the Town's Grants and Governmental Affairs Manager and Lobbying Team for pursuit.
